






## Student's Special Achievements Section: Putter





Dear Parents,

Over the last few weeks, our class has been buzzing with hands-on learning and exciting discoveries. In Science, students cared for their butterfly terrariums and closely observed each stage of the life cycle, all while planting new seeds in our school garden. In Writing, we've been working on informational texts, and in Reading, students have been sharpening their retelling skills with growing confidence. Math time has been full of energy as we strengthened our subtraction strategies through games, models, and partner work. We also ended the term on a high note with a wonderful Winter Concert that showcased their hard work and creativity. Despite many interruptions to learning recently, I am incredibly proud of their resilience and the enthusiasm they continue to bring to our classroom each day.





Dear Parents,

Wow – we are almost at the end of the year! We've had so much excitement in 1B. From our Winter Concert, to writing information books, and learning lots of addition and subtraction strategies, it has been a busy and wonderful time. We've been writing books about butterflies and learning how to take care of them. Students have really enjoyed watching our butterflies go through their lifecycle as they grow from caterpillars, to pupae, and finally to butterflies that will lay more eggs. We even have a special visitor from the North Pole – our very own Elf on the Shelf!





Dear Parents,

Our Mystery Science is all about plants!! What do plants need? How are seeds spread? 2A conducted a fun experiment to investigate whether or not seeds need sunlight to sprout and grow. We planted seeds in cups and put one cup in the sunlight and one in the “dark.” After a week we were surprised to see how the seedlings grew and looked different! Who knew planting could be so much fun?





Dear Parents,

2B has been buzzing with energy lately, and the students show up each day ready to dive right into learning. They're exploring non-fiction in both reading and writing, proudly sharing facts they discover along the way. In math, they're working through two-digit addition and subtraction and beginning to see why neat, organized work actually matters. It's been a full week, but their enthusiasm keeps the classroom lively and fun from start to finish.





Dear Parents,

In 3A, students learned about the important role that fruit plays in protecting and helping seeds grow. We explored how fruits form from flowers and act as a shield for the seeds inside until they're ready to sprout. To deepen their understanding, students participated in a hands-on science activity where they dissected different fruits and vegetables. They closely observed the insides and discussed whether each item was scientifically classified as a fruit or a vegetable. The activity sparked curiosity and helped students connect real-world examples to what they've been learning in class.

3B had a fantastic December! Students created impressive Ancient Egypt books using Book Creator, visited the library for book reports and Christmas surprises, and explored the distributive and associative properties in math. It has been a wonderful year of learning and growth, and we look forward to an even brighter year ahead!

Over the past few weeks, students have been working hard across all subjects. In math, they have been becoming experts at multiplying and dividing through hands-on practice and problem-solving. In science, students have participated in engaging experiments and activities to explore Earth's features and processes, helping them better understand how our planet is constantly changing. In literacy, they have been reading and writing nonfiction, while also uncovering facts from fiction as we continue our class novel *The One and Only Ivan*. We are proud of their effort and growth!

4B has been staying busy as the winter break approaches. We have finished our informational essays and we are working on turning them into books. We are excited to share them with parents when we return! We recently finished our unit on division in math and we have started studying fractions, and in science we wrapped up our unit covering the birth of rocks. Students in G.2TMT learned about “Ho Nam” consonant clusters through songs and rhythmic chants. After the lesson, they worked in groups to summarize their ideas, share their thoughts with classmates, and present their work to build confidence. This activity helped develop their critical thinking, reading, writing, and teamwork skills.

In the past few weeks, our Thai classes have covered both academic content and cultural learning.

For Grade 1 students, we continued to focus on spelling, long vowel sounds, and consonant transformations through a variety of engaging activities, including writing practice, games, and story listening.


## Thai Teacher: Kru Fai




Dear Parents,

### The Thailand Personal Data Protection Act (PDPA)

- The Personal Data Protection Act B.E. 2562 (2019) (PDPA) was published on 27 May 2019 in Thailand's Government Gazette. ([English](#), [Thai](#))
- The PDPA is under the supervision of the Ministry of Digital Economy and Society and the main supervising authority of the PDPA is the Office of Data Protection Committee (Office).
- School is the "Data Controller" means a person or juristic person having decision-making on the collection, use, or disclosure of personal information (PDPA Section 6).

Personal Data	Sensitive Data
Any information relating to a natural person, which enables the identification of such person, whether directly or indirectly, but not including information of deceased persons.	Any personal data pertaining to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• racial or ethnic origin</li><li>• political opinions</li><li>• religious or philosophical beliefs</li><li>• sexual behavior</li><li>• criminal records</li><li>• health data, disability</li><li>• trade union information</li><li>• genetic data, biometric data, or any data which may affect the data subject in the same manner as to be prescribed by the PDPC.</li></ul>

In essence, the PDPA is designed to protect a data owner from the unauthorized or unlawful collection, use, or disclosure and processing of their personal data. As with Europe's GDPR, for example, websites will have to include simple and straightforward language, and receive clear consent from each user, before (or at the time of) collecting such data, using it in any way, or passing it along to third parties.

Another key aspect under the PDPA is the requirement to inform the data subject of (i) how their personal data will be used by the data controller, (ii) whether personal data will be disclosed to a third party, and (iii) of the data subject's rights to their personal data. This must be done at the time the personal data is being collected from the data subject.

The rights of data owners under the PDPA include the following:

- Right to be informed
- Right to access
- Right to data portability
- Right to object
- Right to erasure/ right to be forgotten
- Right to restrict of processing
- Right to rectify

Even foreign entities will need to follow the rules spelled out in the PDPA, as long as they deal with any activities that are related to the processing of personal data such as offering of goods and services or monitoring of users' online behavior, from users who are based in Thailand.

There are both criminal and civil liabilities for breaches of personal data privacy. For instance, the collection, use or disclosure of sensitive personal data illegally is liable to a fine of five million baht on conviction. Collection, use or

disclosure of general personal data without a legal basis is liable to a three million baht fine on conviction, and failing to get consent from data's owner or refusing the data's owner access to their personal data is liable to a one million baht fine on conviction.

If the unauthorized use or disclosure of personal data causes damage to other people or subjects other people to hate, shame or contempt, violators may face six months in prison and/or a fine of 500,000 baht on conviction.

## Nurse: School Health Services

The Nurse Clinic is a spacious and well staffed facility at TCIS that can accommodate several students at any given time of the day. The Nurse Clinic is open daily from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The clinic is located on the ground floor next to the storeroom and staffed by a registered nurse and one nurse's aid. The clinic treats all minor injuries occurring at school. The athletics program has a school nurse who works until the sports games finish.

The clinic stays in touch with the Ministry of Public Health to keep abreast of health notifications. Current vaccination information is sent out to parents for their information and written consent. Students in grade 1 thru grade 6 may get some vaccinations from our nurse according to the Thai Ministry of Public Health. Records of previous vaccinations are kept on file with the school nurse.


A worldwide, comprehensive (24-hour) accident insurance coverage is provided for all students up to 60,000 baht yearly.

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

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
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
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
